Thank you for your information concerning Ar. Frederick Maitland. This will be very helpful to us in order to build our file for the future.

The dismissal of the case certainly weakens any position we would take in refusing registration. We do feel, however, that the facts at hand make Mr. Maitland a rather undesirable registrant at the present time.

I have a copy of the newspaper clipping but since there was a dismissal an arrest record is not a great deal of value.

I am enclosing a Confidential Record Sheet which I would like to have completed. I do believe we can at least notify any Scout Executive if Mr. Maitland tries to register. Refusal would be very difficult in another council after a period of time has passed. The notification of the Executive would at least keep him on the alert in case any situation would arise which would seem to be out of line.

Let me know if there is anything else we can do for you at this time.
