

Man pleads no contest to assault

KENAI - A former Homer Boy Scout troop leader has pleaded no contest to six counts of sexual abuse of a minor, Kenai District

Attorney Tom Wardell said Monday. Under the "charge bargain," Jerry W. Lewis, 44, will receive three consecutive eightyear sentences on three unclassified felony counts stemming from the sexual abuse of several boys under the age of 13, Wardell said. Sentences for unclassified felonies are not subject to parole, he said.

According to Wardell, the state remains "free to argue for whatever sentence is appropriate" on the remaining charges. Lewis could get an additional 40 years in prison on those counts, he said.

In exchange for Lewis' change of plea,

Wardell said, the state agreed to drop five similar counts stemming from multiple contacts with some victims.

Lewis was scheduled to go to trial in early December

By pleading no contest to six felony counts, Lewis agreed to accept verdicts of guilty from the court. The court's finding and the sentence it hands down cannot be appealed. A no contest plea cannot be used as evidence in a civil trial, but under some circumstances, it can be entered in the record of a future criminal proceeding, Wardell said.

Kenai Superior Court Judge Charles Cranston will sentence Lewis Jan. 10.

The charge bargain will spare "young boys in a small town" the emotional trauma of having to testify against Lewis.

Bov Scout leader in Homer accused of molesting boys

A Boy Scout leader in Humer has been arrested and marzed with sexually moiestng two boys. Homer police and Monday.

Jerry Wayne Lewis, 44, a first tierk who was once tamed Homer's "Citizen of the Fear" will be arraigned today on two leiony ounts of sexual abuse of a minor The charges stem from acidents involving the sexual penetration of two juvenies.

police said.

Lewis has been lodged in the Homer Jail and bail has been set at \$100,000. Bond could be reduced by Homer Magistrate Anna Creasey at today's hearing.

According to Officer Andy Klamser of the Homer Police Department, additional charges may be filed within in the next two weeks.

After talking with past and

present members of one local Scout troop, police said they believe that Lewis has been sexually involved with about a dozen boys over the past

four or five years.

Some of the incidents octioned activities. Klamser said.

A complaint last week by the parents of one troop member sparked the investigation. said Sgt. Luther Christopher.

Homer residents describe Lewis as a "respected, popular pillar of the community" has invested hours of effort in local youth pro-

According to police, Lewis has lived in the area for nine years and been involved in scouring for eight. Although other adults were involved with program, Lewis is generally credited with making the program a successful one

His first troop was spon-sored by the Homer Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"He was our scoutmaster." said church member Jerry Anderson. "He broke off and

formed his own troop after a while because he wanted to

do a lot of things on Sunday.

We nated to see him go because the guy was good at working with kids. He was super good. Kids toved him."

Anderson described Lewis as a "middle-aged man, never married, who spends all of his

time with boys."
In the late '70s, the Homer Chamber of Commerce honored Lewis for his commitment
