Sentencing Sept. 19 For Scouting Official

A Boy Scout official from Tully will serve no more than a year in prison for sodomizing a 12-year-old boy last year.

Bryan Barner, 26, of 6 Lincoln St. pleaded guilty in County Court Wednesday to second-degree sodomy. Judge Patrick J. Cunningham said he will sentence Barner to no more than a year in the Onondaga County Correctional Facility if the county Probation Department recommends incarceration. Sentencing is scheduled for Sept. 19.

In June, Barner was indicted on charges of second-degree sodomy, second-degree sexual abuse and endangering the welfare of a child. According to the indictment, the incidents occurred in November and May.

When Barner was arrested in May, the state police identified him as a unit commissioner with the Boy Scouts.

Scout leader pleads guilty to one charge of sodomy

A suburban Boy Scout leader pleaded guilty today in County Court to sodomizing a young boy he had met through the scouting program last year.

Bryan A. Barner, 27, of Lincoln Street, Tully, pleaded guilty before Judge Patrick J. Cunningham to a felony charge of second-degree sodomy.

Although Barner could have faced up to seven years in prison for the conviction, Cunningham indicated he would sentence him to no more than one year in the Onondaga County Correctional Facility if jail is recommended.

"My understanding is you're addressing your problem — you have a problem," the judge said as Barner stood before him.

In court, Barner admitted only that he engaged in deviate sexual intercourse with a person younger than 14 last Nov. 24. Cunningham did not ask him for any more detailed pleading because of what he said was the "sensitive" nature of the crime.

A grand jury in June handed up a nine-count indictment accusing Barner of three counts each of second-degree sodomy, second-degree sexual abuse and endangering the welfare of a child.

The charge to which Barner pleaded guilty today specifically accused him of sodomizing a 12-year-old boy last Nov. 24.

Officials said the overall indictment related to the sodomy and sexual abuse of two 12-year-old boys last Nov. 24. One of the youths also was sodomized again on May 7, the indictment charged.

State police, in announcing Barner's arrest in May, said he was a unit commissioner for the Boy Scouts in the Tully area. The victims were said to have met Barner through the scouting program, investigators reported.

Lavere said police believe Stribling fled to his mother's house soon after his indictment on 61 charges of raping, sodomizing and abusing four 14- and 15-year-old female inmates at the Hillbrook Detention Center. Stribling, 29, was a part-time counselor at the center for youths.

Supporting the police suspicions on Stribling's location were subpoenaed telephone records showing many calls from Stribling's mother's home to his uncle's home in Syracuse, Lavere said.

He said Memphis police told him they could not find Stribling. But he and Inv. Gene Rifenburg of the state police violent felony warrant unit kept urging the police to check again.

On Friday, the Shelby County Sheriff's Department nabbed Stribling near his mother's home.

"He's not that hard to spot because he's 5-foot-9 and weighs 300 pounds," Lavere said.

Stribling is being held in a Memphis jail in lieu of \$1 million bail. An arraignment and a hearing on whether he should be sent here is scheduled for Monday.

of burglarizing a home on Oak Drive in North Syracuse and brutally attacking the resident last year.

Stribling, who worked at the Hillbrook center from December 1981 to June 1982, was arrested and charged with several sex charges in June 1982. But he was released on his own recognizance when the District Attorney did not send a representative to his preliminary hearing. District Attorney Richard A. Hennessy Jr. said at the time that is sometimes part of the prosecution strategy.

But Stribling fled when he was indicted in December on 61 charges, including rape, sexual abuse, sodomy, unlawful imprisonment, coercion and official misconduct. The indictment said Stribling allowed the girls extra privileges in return for sex.

A second employee was accused of acting as a lookout for Stribling. But a judge dismissed four charges against her because he found insufficient evidence to prosecute her.

The state police have not yet put a new name on the 12 most-wanted list.

Boy Scout official faces sex charge arraignment

A suburban Boy Scout official is expected to be arraigned next week in County Court after being indicted Friday on charges he sexually molested two teen-aged boys last year.

The same county grand jury that handed up that indictment also handed up sex-related indictments against three other men. One charged a deaf man with raping an East Side woman last month and another charged a Fayetteville man with raping his 3-year-old granddaughter.

Another of the indictments reported out of the district attorney's office Friday, accusing a suburban man of burglary and sodomy, is under review by a County Court judge. The defense attorney in the case complained Thursday his client wasn't given an opportunity to appear before the grand jury before the indictment was voted on earlier this week.

In the first case, Bryan Alan Barner, 26, of 6 Lincoln St., Tully, is accused of two counts each of second-degree sodomy, second-degree sexual abuse and endangering the welfare of a child.

Authorities said the victims were two 13-year-old boys Barner reportedly met through the Boy Scouts. State police, in announcing Barner's arrest May 31, identified him as a unit commissioner for the Boy Scouts in the Tully area.

Although the incidents are alleged to have occurred last Nov. 24, officials said the matter did not come to light until late last month when one of the victims reported the incident to his parents.

Barner is free on bail pending disposition of the charges.

Assistant District Attorney W. Patrick Mullin is handling Barner's case as well as the case against the 59-year-old Fayetteville grandfather. That defendant, whose name

is not being printed by The Herald-Journal to protect the identity of the victim, was charged by the grand jury with single counts of first-degree rape, first-degree sodomy, first-degree sexual abuse, incest and endangering the welfare of a child.

Officials said the incident resulting in the charges occurred last March 24 while the defendant was baby-sitting for the victim.

Bail in the case, which had been set at \$25,000 cash or \$50,000 bond, was cut in half Thursday by state Supreme Court Justice Walter Gorman, Mullin said.

The same grand jury also returned an indictment charging Mikel Wixted, 24, of 516 E. Willow St., with first-degree rape, first-degree sexual abuse and first- and second-degree burglary in connection with a May 20 incident in which a 22-year-old East Side woman was attacked in her apartment.

Officials said Wixted, who is deaf and cannot talk, wrote notes to the victim during the incident, including one in which he left his name and address.

Police charged that Wixted forced his way into the woman's apartment after she answered a knock on her door.

In the case where the indictment

is being challenged by the defense, 21-year-old William P. Baez of 6445 Bennetts Corners Road in Memphis, is facing charges of first-degree burglary, first-degree sodomy and third-degree assault in connection with a June 16 incident in the town of Elbridge.

In County Court Thursday, Baez's attorney, Edward Z. Menkin, asked Judge William J. Burke to dismiss the indictment and order the case presented to a new grand jury because Baez was not given an opportunity to appear before the panel that returned the indictment.

Menkin accused the prosecution of having the grand jury vote on the indictment last Monday to avoid having to conduct a preliminary examination scheduled for that night in court in Elbridge.

A defendant charged with a felony has a right to appear before the grand jury considering the charges. But Menkin argued that he was first given notice that the grand jury was considering the case about 5 p.m. Monday, sometime after the panel had voted to indict Baez.

Although the district attorney's office has agreed to allow Baez to come in and tell his story to the same grand jury, Menkin asked that the case be presented to a different panel. He told Burke he didn't believe Baez could get a fair hearing before a group of people who already had decided there was suffi-

cient reason to charge him with the crime.

Menkin said Baez and six witnesses who can testify the defendant was somewhere else when the burglary occurred would be willing to be called before a new grand jury.

After saying he thought the case "sounds like a very fast rush to judgment," Burke Thursday reserved decision on Menkin's motion.

In yet another indictment reported out of the district attorney's office Friday, the grand jury charged Lewis McKinney, 45, of 747 W. Onondaga St., with first-degree rape, first-degree sexual abuse and two counts of endangering the welfare of a child in connection with an incident last October that reportedly involved two young girls.

State police charged a Tully man Thursday with second-degree sodomy and endangering the welfare of a child.

Arrested was Bryan Alan Barner, 26, of 6 Lincoln St. Barner is a unit commissioner with the Boy Scouts, police said.

Police said the arrest stems from incidents involving two 13-year-old boys, whose names are being withheld.

Barner was arraigned before LaFayette Town Justice Malcolm Knapp and released on a \$1,000 bail bond. The case was adjourned to 7:30 p.m. June 13.

Boy Scout official charged with mole

State police arrested a 26-year-old Tully Boy Scout official Thursday and charged him with sexually molesting two 13-year-old boys he met through the troop.

The man's neighbors and colleagues in the Tully Fire Department spoke well of him. But those he knew through scouting told of a "dictatorial" organizer whose enthusiasm outstripped his authority.

Bryan Alan Barner, 26, of 6 Lincoln St., Tully, was charged with second-degree sodomy and endangering the welfare of a child.

He was picked up in the village of Tully Thursday afternoon after a three-day investigation that began when one of the boys told his parents of the incidents, said Inv. Thomas Murfitt of the LaFayette barracks.

Barner apparently had been involved with one of the boys for eight months, said Murfitt. The other boy is said to have been involved only once.

"This didn't happen during the scout meetings," Murfitt said. "One of the boys was a local resident. They struck up a friendship, and it just went much further than it should have."

Friends said Barner, an Air Force veteran who recently resigned from the Army National Guard in Syracuse, is engaged to be married in the fall. He told police he had never been arrested on anything more serious than a traffic violation.

He was arraigned in front of LaFayette Justice Malcolm W. Knapp Thursday afternoon and sent to the Public Safety Building jail when he couldn't produce \$1,000 bail.

Barner's court-appointed attorney, William J. Kurtz, said he knew no details because the case had just been assigned to him.

A police press release listed Barner as a unit commander for
