After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be suspended. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with Boy Scouts of America.

You should understand that BSA leadership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to suspend registration whenever there is a concern that an individual may not measure up to the high standards of leadership which BSA seeks to provide for American youth. Please also understand that this decision and the reasons for it will be maintained confidential.

If you seek to have this decision reviewed, please write to me. I will then see to it that a committee of three Foy Scout volunteers meets with you to consider your case.

You will be required to return all registration cards to the Detroit Area Council that are now in your possession.

The Land Claims College is the first of its kind. All the program material is put together and sent out to 47 villages in Alaska. My department not only produced, (both film & color video tape) the programs but also wrote and printed the texts and the needed materials in three languages. We, also, had to desiminate and replenish all the materials for the students in the villages.

I designed and set up the department to do all of it own production, including designing of a new building to house the entire operation. We do all of our own printing and typesetting in 3 languages and produce in a million dollar television studio. We utilize ATS 1 and ATS 6 satalites for TV communications.

Unfortunately, the program is only funded until July 1 under a federal grant to see if such a program could be developed. I proved it could.

I spoke at the NEA International Convention in Dallas, Texas las November on the Rural Media Approach. I also spent 3 days at the Methodist University in Dallas speaking.

In January I was again asked to speak on my program at the National Audio Visual Convention in New Orleans. I also spoke at the University of Washington on my way home.

Dear Earl:

This letter of transmittal is to give you information on Robert F. Elliott, a former assistant scoutmaster in the Ore-Ida Council. Enclosed you will find a letter dated March 24, 1971 signed by Committee Chairman for Troop 7 which strongly indicates that Robert F. Elliott (Bob) is not the type of individual we wish to have registered and associated with the Boy Scouts of America.

Robert F. Elliott was first brought to our attention in 1969 prior to his discharge from the United States Air Force at Mountain Home Air Force Base in our Council. The District Scout Executive serving the base at that time was told by two different officers that this man should be watched and that he should not be allowed to associate with the Boy Scouts of America. Because the Air Force was unwilling or unable to give us any factual information concerning Mr. Elliott, no action was taken by our office. During 1970 on numerous occasions this office received reports of unorthodox or strange behavior on the part of Mr. Elliott and we did everything in our power to keep him separated from boy programs. Mr. Elliott appeared to be a more than willing volunteer and did his utmost to be involved in every Council program during 1970. At one time it was reported to us that Mr. Elliott had passed himself off as an employee of the Boy Scouts of America and again on another occasion he had passed himself off as the Camp Director for one of our Council camps.

During the year 1970 my Field Director checked into Robert F. Elliott's discharge from the United States Armed Forces. He found that his DD-214 was recorded in the Ada County Courthouse and that it stated that this man was given a General Discharge because he was unfit for military service after approximately two and one half years of a 4 year enlistment. Under the general heading of Recommendation For Re-enlistment the word "elimination" was entered.

Mr. Elliott has been involved in two very questionable situations involving Scouts in the last 4 months, and with the reorganization of Troop 7 many questionable relationships with Scouts were uncovered.

Because of the enclosed letter, the information we have been able to gather and our own suspicions it is my recommendation that this man be placed on the Confidential File. Please be advised that Robert F. Elliott is not currently registered in any capacity with the Ore-Ida Council or the Boy Scouts of America. It should be noted however, that he is trying to form an Explorer Post in the city of Boise. He has made contact with

three different (possible) sponsoring institutions, each of which we have been able to discourage prior to the formation of a Post.

I have turned a copy of this letter over to my attorney and to the Chief of Police of the city of Boise. I will take no further action until I hear from your office.

about two years ago in April of 1969. Bob was invited to spend the weekend which he did. This began a series of weekend visits unannounced to the nome. During these visits and ensuing friendship, Bob offered to give body massages. He did not at this time make any advances, but now feels that this was an effort to gain his confidence.

At a later time after these week-end visits, Bob had time off from his base at mountain Home, and spent a full week at the home. At this time, Bob and were talking about girls when Bob offered to show how to make out or seduce girls. He put his hand upon his knee and progressed upward to the groin area and felt the genitals. He them moved to the top of beltline and attempted to put his hand under, or inside his trousers. When objected to this, Bob put on the hurt act, and told that in order to be his friend, he would have to allow him to continue or the friendship was off.

It was during the weekend stays, that Bob tried many times to encourage to masturbate in his presence, or they would practice this act together. After Bob acquired his apartment, he invited numerous times to spend the night together for this purpose.

told this to me of his own accord in the presence of his Father with full knowledge that this information would go to the Boy scout beadquarters file.

Since the time that Troop 7's adult committee took action to accept Bob's threat to resign, it has been learned from some of our scouts that Bob had invited many boys to his place to practice masturbation. Some have reported offers of other unnatural acts. These reports were difficult to substantiate because we could not easily determine fact from rumor, however at least one other boy is willing to be identified by name in substantiating these reports should this be necessary. In my estimation, hr. Bob Elliott should be defied contact as leader of any youth group.
