

This statement was given voluntarily by Dennis R. Page, DOB 8/29/39, Surrey, N. Dak., to Deputy Sheriffs James Nelson and Pauline Howard regarding incidents reported to this office by juveniles from the Surrey area.

Mr. Page was advised of his rights and signed the Acknowledgement and Waiver of Rights. He agreed to give a statement and to seek voluntary help on his own rather than being committed to an institution. He readily admitted having a problem and promises to seek professional help.

The following is a question-answer statement conducted between Deputy James Nelson and Dennis Page:

Deputy Nelson: Mr. Page, could you give us a brief background regarding your problem--perhaps going back to the time you lived in Mohall?

Dennis Page: I can't remember a specific incident or anything that particular other than that I guess it just seems to happen. But I realize it has been a definite problem. I have tried to fight it on my own but I realize now that it hasn't worked but I have been afraid to admit it to anyone else.

- Q. Is it true that at one time you were an ordained Nazarene minister? A. I was a licensed minister. I voluntarily surrendered my license without any admission.
- Q. Is it also true that you are very active in Boys' Scouts? I have been in the past but I have since resigned as Scout Master and Troop Master. I am still on the committee, but I have not been active lately because of the pressures of work.
- numerous Q. Is it true that you have had/personal encounters with men in the Surrey area?
- A. Some, not numerous--possibly two or three. I have talked to others but that's as far as it went.
- Q. When these encounters are over with, what is your mental state at that time. Do you feel remorse or what?
- A. Well, I regret it and I'm sorry that I did it.
- Q. Have you discussed this problem with anyone--your wife or anyone else?
- A. No, I haven't. As far as ever having admitted it, I haven't to anyone.
- Q. Are you willing to seek help if it means going to an institution for a whi
- A. I am willing and I want to seek help but I am in hopes that I will not have to go to an institution primarily because of my job and my family, but if there is no other recourse I will do it.

Q. But you will definitely seek help? You will try to get this help as soon as possible.

A. I will not only try--I will definitely seek help.

Nelson--Okay, I believe that is all. At this point it will stay a confidential matter. It will remain this way so long as you go ahead and seek help voluntarily, and your job should not be influenced by this at all.
