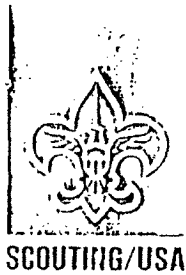



# Sexual assaults probed

11/16/77

A grand jury is investigating incidents related to the arrest of two Colorado Springs men who have been jailed on complaints of sexual assaults on children, sheriff's deputies said Tuesday.

The two men are Harold Carl Voges, 25, of 110 Grinnell St. and Alan Matthew Lenich, 19, of 2919 Cambridge Court, said Detectives Kathy Woosley and Deanna Olmstead.

Voges has been released from El Paso County Jail on a personal recognizance bond, according to jail records. Bond on Lenich, who remains in custody, was set at \$8,500.

Voges was arrested on one count of sexual assault on a child without force and one count of

conspiracy to commit sexual assault without force, Ms. Woosley said.

Lenich was arrested on two counts of sexual assault on a child without force, one count of sexual assault on a child with force and one count of conspiracy to commit sexual assault on a child without force, jail records showed.

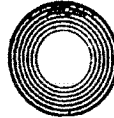
The arrests were made following a car accident involving one of the men. During investigation of the accident, law enforcement officials discovered several lurid snapshots of children, Ms. Woosley said.

Further information led sheriff's officials to believe the men were connected to the sex-

ual assaults of four young boys that occurred "during various social activities in the Widefield area," Ms. Woosley said.

The grand jury investigation is being headed by Deputy Dist. Atty. Cindy Pring.

### Scout leaders charged

Two former Boy Scout leaders were charged Thursday in connection with alleged sexual assaults on a member of their troop and a boy who was a babysitter for one of the leaders.

Harold Voges, 25, of 110 Grinnell St., was charged with conspiracy to commit sexual assault on a child without force, and Alan Lenich, 19, of 2919 Cambridge Court, with two counts of sexual assault on a child without force.

Voges was scoutmaster of Troop 173 and Lenich was his assistant. The alleged victims are 9 and 13 years old.

The incidents allegedly occurred between July 1976 and the spring of 1977.

Buddy Sample, field master of the regional Boy Scout movement, said the two men were removed from their posts last summer when the allegations came to light.

The case came to the attention of authorities when Lenich had a car accident and a garage repairman found allegedly lurid photos of children inside the vehicle.

In the eight years he has been associated with scouting he said this is only the second time such allegations have been made.

"It is not widespread, especially when you consider that we have about 2,000 Boy Scout leaders here."

Voges and Lenich were arrested last week. They are scheduled to appear for arraignment today in Fourth Judicial District Court.

Conspiracy in this case is a Class-5 felony, carrying, upon conviction, a prison term of up to five years. Sexual assault on a child without force is a Class-4 felony, carrying, upon conviction, up to 10 years.

## Innocent pleas entered

Two former Boy Scout leaders, charged with sexual assault, pleaded innocent Thursday in Fourth Judicial District Court.

Harold Voges, 25, of 110 Grinnell St., and Alan Lenich, 19, of 2919 Cambridge Court, will stand trial Feb. 27.

Voges, who was the scoutmaster, is charged with conspiracy to commit sexual assault on a child without force.

Lenich, his former assistant, is charged with two counts of sexual assault on a child without force.

The alleged victims are 9 and 12. One was a member of the troop. The other was a babysitter.



# Study Says Easing Voter Rules Won't Aid Turnout

WASHINGTON (AP) — A preliminary study of the Nov. 8 elections indicates, contrary to commonly held belief, that easing registration requirements will not necessarily increase voter turnouts, a private research organization reported Wednesday.

The Committee for the Study of the American Electorate, a bipartisan, non-profit group, also reported a continuing, substantial drop in balloting among eligible voters, a nearly two-decade-old trend.

The study covered races for governor in New Jersey and Virginia; mayoral races in Atlanta, Cleveland, Detroit, Louisville, Minneapolis, New York and Pittsburgh; and a statewide referendum in Ohio.

The committee reported what it called a new and significant trend of declining participation among registered voters.

The decline was sharpest in states which recently adopted postcard registration, the study said, although there was a slight increase in the rate of voting in states which used election day registration.

New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania, which have adopted postcard registration in the past four years, have experienced voting drops of from 15 percent to 30 percent over the past decade, the study said.

A grand jury is investigating incidents related to the arrest of two Colorado Springs men who have been jailed on complaints of sexual assaults on children, sheriff's deputies said Tuesday.

The two men are Harold Carl Voges, 25, of 110 Grinnell St. and Alan Matthew Lenich, 19, of 2919 Cambridge Court, said Detectives Kathy Woosley and Donna Olmstead.

Voges has been released from El Paso County Jail on a personal recognizance bond, according to jail records. Bond on Lenich, who remains in custody, was set at \$8,500.

Voges was arrested on one count of sexual assault on a child without force and one count of

conspiracy to commit sexual assault without force, Ms. Woosley said.

Lenich was arrested on two counts of sexual assault on a child without force, one count of sexual assault on a child with force and one count of conspiracy to commit sexual assault on a child without force, jail records showed.

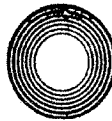
The arrests were made following a car accident involving one of the men. During investigation of the accident, law enforcement officials discovered several lurid snapshots of children, Ms. Woosley said.

Further information led sheriff's officials to believe the men were connected to the sex-

ual assaults of four young boys that occurred "during various social activities in the Wildfield area," Ms. Woosley said.

### Scout leaders charged

Two former Boy Scout leaders were charged Thursday in connection with alleged sexual assaults on a member of their troop and a boy who was a babysitter for one of the leaders.

Harold Voges, 25, of 110 Grinnell St., was charged with conspiracy to commit sexual assault on a child without force, and Alan Lenich, 19, of 2919 Cambridge Court, with two counts of sexual assault on a child without force.

Voges was scoutmaster of Troop 173 and Lenich was his assistant. The alleged victims are 9 and 13 years old.

The incidents allegedly occurred between July 1976 and the spring of 1977.

Buddy Sample, field master of the regional Boy Scout movement, said the two men were removed from their posts last summer when the allegations came to light.

The case came to the attention of authorities when Lenich had a car accident and a garage repairman found allegedly lurid photos of children inside the vehicle.

In the eight years he has been associated with scouting he said this is only the second time such allegations have been made.

"It is not widespread, especially when you consider that we have about 2,000 Boy Scout leaders here."

Voges and Lenich were arrested last week. They are scheduled to appear for arraignment today in Fourth Judicial District Court.

Conspiracy in this case is a Class-5 felony, carrying, upon conviction, a prison term of up to five years. Sexual assault on a child without force is a Class-4 felony, carrying, upon conviction, up to 10 years.
