Letter to Council PRESIDENT

I find this report very hard to write. It means that I have to defend myself from something accused of me that I feel I have innocense in. I have to point out 15 years of service and the things that I have accomplished in those 15 years, such as having 5 Eagle scouts while Scoutmaster and others that I have counseled for the rank of Eagle. I find it hard to accept that I am banished due to accusations, without the chance to defend myself. Even the courts of law require innocense until found guilty beyond a resonable doubt.

I point out at this time that I am securing legal counsel from Attorney Bill Tanguay of Dover, for possible defamation law suit.

In reference to your Appendix D, I am hereby requesting a review of the previous decision of my case.

My service to your program speaks for itself for the past 15 or more years of service. I have been Scoutmaster for Troop 175. While with this troop, I worked with Robert White and others who will vouch for my integrity and leadership qulities working directly with the boys. I have worked for 5 years with Dave and Moe and others at Hidden Valley. As Vol. Commissioner, I spent an average three weeks per summer. This equals 15 solid weeks of many hours working with their program. My character esteem can be verified by both Dave Johnston and Moe Trombly, and many summer staff past and present. I could obtain a character reference from any of them. I have worked within my district as Commissioner, O &A, Roundtable Comm., conducted Eagle ceremonies for many recepients, plus many other capacities, which you all know about.

My past services included, serving in Viet Nam in combat for the U. S. Marine Corps. I have been married and have two children. I served the First United Methodist Church of Rochester also.

As a member of the Methodist Church, I seed as a certified Lay Speaker. I was the Youth Coordinator for a number of years. I served as a Sunday School teacher for a number of years. I was also the youth advisor for the high school youth.

I am also a Senior DeMolay member and have served as an Advisor for the Clarence Woodman Chapter in Rochester.

I served on the Salvation Advisory Board for a number of years.

I have also work with the Rochester chapter of Red Cross, and act as Disastor chairman.

I also work with the Rochester Youth Hockey program, specifi-cally the Midget red team.

I haven't gone into a lot of detail of my past services of youth, as I don't feel that it is necessay. I don't look for reward.

My stay at Teen-Haven, Inc. was for seven months. The boys there come from broken, mistreated, and abused homes. More than 50% are in some degree, retarded. While there, I tried to initiate new programs of reform that would present some type of therapy rather then the "baby sitting service" in existance. I had caught serveral at shop-lifting, some of drug abuse, plus other problems. One boy had a problem of violent explosion due to an emotional problem. Rather than hitting him, I tried to show him love by hugging him and showing him that I cared. We would talk a lot. amd I would give him attention. He is undergoing therapy sessions at Strafford Guidance Clinic. Two boys had a problem of bed wetting almost every night. I sent them to Dr. Roy, who gave them pills, plus I would get up every night for 3 weeks solid at 12 midnight and take them to the bathroom until they seemed to break the habit. These are just two stories of my counseling that could be misconstrued. But I also made a few enemies, I'm certain. I had discovered one boy on drugs and was in the process of getting him

into a drug rehabilitating program, just before I resigned. I had also caught two in an embarrassing situation and had confronted them about it. I also had to use corporal punishment on a few boys, who vowed they would "get even" with me, even if it meant "burning" me. But I took all of this is stride as it was part of the job. I feel that there could be a number of reasons of why rumors started to fly and accussations were given to an over-reacting female counselor.

I just feel that a wrong has been done to me and that your review of the situation will find that things werd blown out of proportion. I also understand that even though there are quite a few people that know of this situation already, I expect it to still be confidential due to the possible law suit involved.

Dear Mr. Gilbert:

I have received your letter which was hand delivered by Rick Bassett and Bob Thompson. I must admit that it was probably the most disparaging thing ever to happen to me.

I have dadicated myself to over 15 years of Scouting service, in many different areas of responsibilities.

As working as Counselor, I know I made some enemies, especially when it envolved drug "busts". I expected some retaliation due to some of my disciplinary tactics at Teen Haven. We thought it even best that I resign among other reasons, due to my credibility with the trouble makers living there. I was even threatened that they "would get even with me", at times. I have discussed all this with the Executive Director, Nelson McLean.

And now, my whole integrity is at stake plus my own self esteem. I had intended to work at the Valley this summer as Head Commissioner for Moe.

Considering that there may be a legal involvment concerning defamation of character, whether it be libel or slander. Due to the seriousness of the matter, I have the right to know just what the charge is and from what source.

Yes, I would like to be able to defend myself and be reinstated. Although I am not now in a leadership capacity, I would like to continue on my District Staff level and be able to help Moe this summer in the Administrative level.

Regard For Review

JIM CURRIER UPDATE - 2/13/81

Met with Nelson McLean, former director of Austin-Cate Academy, Center Strafford, at the Academy where he is still a resident, on Friday morning, February 13. Rick Bassett, Spaulding-Bay District Executive, was also present. McLean is supposedly active in the Y.M.C.A. program at the state level.

Reviewed the case to date and heard McLean's explanation of the facts first-hand, for the first time. Essentially no change in the previous testimony given by his staff members and others.

McLean stated that he did in fact feel that the "verbal evidence" - accusations made by the young people involved - left no real doubt in his mind that the alleged acts did take place. He did suggest two options to Currier: 1) that he accompany McLean to the police station in Rochester where they would meet with the juvenile officer who was also a member of the Teen Center board; OR submit his resignation. He chose the latter route without question and, using a sheet of paper on McLean's desk, hastily and angrilly wrote out a terse, one-sentence letter of resignation. No written reason was given.

McLean said that he later learned that Currier that very day went to the unemployment office to file. When this was reported to McLean, he informed the unemployment office that Currier had resigned and that he would fight the case on principle. A hearing was subsequently scheduled but Currier withdrew his claim before any meeting would take place.

McLean has offered to repeat his story, either in court or privately to our attorney if necessary.

It was agreed by those present that the next move is Currier's and we shall wait to see if any further action is taken by him.

CONFIDENTIAL MATTER RE: JIM CURRIER

A meeting of the review committee appointed by Council President Rane Gilbert met in the office of the Assistant Council Executive, Ron Titus, at 9:00am, Thursday, March 26, 1981. These present were President Gilbert, Del Gilbert (Rene's brother), Fr. Lee LeBlanc, Atty. Douglas McIninch, and Ron Titus.

The purpose of the committee was defined and the case history of Jim Currier was reviewed. Copies of all data collected to date was distributed with the instructions that it be treated as confidential.

Following nearly a three hour session it was determined that each member would take the material with him to review in detail. During the next week questions needing answers would be called in to Ron Titus. In addition, to seeking the answers Ron would contact Nelson McLean and arrange for him to meet with the committee at a date and place agreeable to him. The week of April 20th was suggested.

It was also felt that a letter should be sent to Currier advising him that a review was being conducted. It is expected that there will be one more meeting of the committee at which time a decision will be reached regarding the suspension of Currier's registration.

On Tyesday, April 21, 1981 the above committee minus Del Gilbert travelled to Austin-Cate Academy in Center Strafford, New Hampshire to meet with its director Nelson McLean. Mr. McLean reviewed the incidents which led to his dismissal at the Rochester Teen Center and answered a number of questions that the committee members had concerning the alledged conduct of Currier at the Teen Center and of action taken by members of the staff there at the Center.

It was learned that Mr. Currier has also been dismissed as a "permanent" substitute teacher in the Rechester, New Hampshire school system. We are led to believe that the dismissal also stemmed from the alledged incidents at the Taen Center.

In adherence to the guidelines set forth by the National Council in its material "Maintaining Standards of Leadership", the committee felt it had no recourse but to affirm its original decision to deny Mr. Currier registration in the Movement. He is being so advised and also reminded of the opportunity he still has to have his case heared at the Regional level.

APPENDIX B letter hand delivered to Mr. Currier on January 27, 1981 by District Executive Rick Bassett and Assistant District Commissioner Bob Thompson. Confirming telephone call received by me on Jan. 28th. Currier expressed shock that this could and did happen and stated that he'll fight the Teen Center with his attorney.

On January 30, a letter was received at the Council Service Center addressed to Mr. Gilbert, the Council President (copy of letter enclosed). In the letter Currier asked to be informed of the specific charges and of the source of same.

Later on January 30, a copy of ADDIX D. (Applicant's Procedures For Requesting Review Of Decision Which Denies Registration) was mailed to Currier. Also, the District Executive was instructed to personally telephone him informing him that the information was in the mail to him. In addition he will verbally inform him that three different people have made charges informally that he (Currier) has been engaged in homosexual acts with minors, etc. No names are to be given.

Dave Park has been advised of the actions taken on January 30th and is in agreement. He did advise that we bring in our local attorney at this point and this will be done irmediately.

Should Mr. Currier request a review at the Council level we shall follow the procedures outlined in our "Maintaining Standards of Leadership" packet and you will be kept informed.

Dear Mr. Currier:

To the Boy Scouts of America,

The above named individual has recently been involved in an incident at Teen Haven, a group home for boys, that reflects in a negative manner or his moral character.

Mr. Currier was employed by Teen Haven as a counselor in June of 1980. Recently it was bought to our attention by Teen Haven that Jim had allegedly been involved in a homosexual relationship with one of our wards and had made sexual advances towards two of our other wards at the home. The descriptions given by the boys in the alleged incidents seemed to have enough substance to warrant an investigation by the staff at Teen Haven.

When confronted about the incident by the staff, Mr. Currier did not deny it and immediately submitted his resignation and left the home.

Court action was not taken due to Teen Haven wishing to avoid had publicity.

We feel the incident did occur and the fact that Mr. Currier did not deny it and did resign, gives credence towards the allegation. Because Mr. Currier is involved in Boy Scouts, we feel it is important that the council becomes aware of the allegations.
