Man gets 15 years for molesting Scouts

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. — A man who pleaded guilty to molesting young Boy Scouts on camping trips was sentenced to 15 years in prison despite a request for leniency from the mother of two victims.

Joe N. Gibson, 42, was Scoutmaster of a Pinellas County troop until his arrest last August. Thirteen complaints were filed and he pleaded guilty to four charges of handling and fondling a child.

Prosecutor Eileen Jacobs said some of the boys said they submitted to Gibson so they could get ahead in scouting.

Circuit Court Judge Thomas E. Perick sentenced Gibson to 60 years in prison, with all but 15 years suspended and the remainder probated.

Some parents insisted that Gibson go to jail. But one woman, whose two sons were molested, told the judge Mr. Gibson has an illness and prison will not help him. With love, my children have understood that Mr. Gibson has an illness.

Scout leader sentenced to 15-year term in sex case

Joe Noel Gibson, leader of a Boy Scout troop, did not deny what he had done to his boys. And a doctor said he was sick — pedophilia, an abnormal sexual attraction for children.

The question, however, that divided parents and confronted the judge: Should Gibson be sent to jail or treated in a hospital?

He got jail.

Pinellas Circuit Judge Thomas E. Penick Jr. sentenced Gibson to 60 years in prison Friday. Penick suspended all but 15 years of the sentence but ordered the 42-year-old man to spend the balance of the time under probation. During that time he must remain in counseling and be forbidden any contact with children other than his own.

EVEN WITH an early parole, Penick said, Gibson would spend at least 10 years in jail. He will be on probation until he is 102.

Gibson was scoutmaster of a troop in mid-Pinellas County when he was arrested last August. The incidents had occurred on camping trips and in Gibson's home at 15555 60th St. N.

Prosecutor Eileen Jacobs said some of the boys had felt they should submit to Gibson in order to advance in the troop. Some boys told sheriff's deputies that they had been afraid Gibson might beat them if they resisted or told their parents.

Eventually, however, one boy did tell his parents. They called other parents, and the story emerged.

Gibson pleaded guilty to four charges of handling and fondling a child and one charge of committing a lewd and lascivious act in the presence of a child. Each charge involved a different boy.

At the sentencing Friday, most parents were adamant that Gibson be punished. "It's going to take me years as a stepfather to get (my) three boys to trust another male adult," said a man whose sons were abused.

A WOMAN remembered one of her sons asking her, "Do I have to go on this camping trip, Mom?" She had said yes.

He dutifully obeyed, she recalled, and was forced to have sex with Gibson in his tent that night.

Jacobs said Gibson was supposed to have been a role model for his scouts. Instead, she said, "I think he should have been one of the worst lessons about morality in our society."

Some dissent here has been expressed. Jacobs said she had heard from five other parents on the case. All but one said Gibson should go to jail.

THAT PARENTS and several other persons felt differently.

One woman said Gibson had molested her two sons. But she brought them to the courtroom Friday and told the judge, "Mr. Gibson has an illness

and prison will not help him. With love, my children have understood that Mr. Gibson has an illness. Our children have visited him in jail. Our family loves Mr. Gibson."

A professor at Asbury Theological Seminary and the director of Florida United Methodist Camps, for whom Gibson has worked as a youth director, both wrote letters on his behalf.

Gibson's wife Berna Lu and his defense attorney Frank Quesada said society would be better served if Gibson got psychiatric help. "Prison aggravates these kinds of illnesses," said Quesada. "Society is better off if Mr. Gibson will be back in society."

GIBSON TOLD Penick that he had sought counseling for his problem long before he was arrested. But the crime he went to was "less discreet than I expected," he said, and he stopped going. Now he said he has no other chance. In the time I've been out, I've been able to control the situation.

Mr. Gibson, you have failed a lot of people, including yourself," said Penick. "Don't hope that in the remainder of your life you remember that in a civilized world we have rules and laws, and not individual has the right to break them."

In announcing his sentence, Penick said he would recommend that Gibson spend some time at a sex offenders' treatment center run by state prison officials in Gainesville. Penick said the center will take people for a maximum of two years.

Gibson, tears in his eyes and his wife at his side, was fingerprinted as two daughters stood crying behind him. The two boys whose mother had asked for leniency stared from the front row. After a five-minute goodbye to his family in private rooms, Gibson was taken away.

QUESADA LATER told Penick that the sentence was one of the harshest for such a crime he had seen in court. Penick had told Quesada that Gibson's psychological report troubled him. "The report is not a public document."

Afterward, Penick spoke generally of the difficulties judges face when a person is sick but has also done something wrong. "If a person must be punished as well as rehabilitated," the judge implied, "reasonable precautions must be taken to protect the public from the defendant's future crimes. Others who might commit the same crime must be warned."

Quesada said he understood Jacobs, the prosecutor, was subdued. For a while, nobody smiled.

Legally blind Boy Scout leader faces sex abuse charges

CLEARWATER — A legally blind Boy Scout troop leader has been arrested and charged with involuntary sexual battery and lewd and lascivious conduct with members of his troop ages 10 to 12.

Pinalosa Sheriff's Detective Sgt. Terry McKenna of the juvenile unit said Noel Gibson, 42, of 15555 60th St. N., Clearwater, was arrested Sunday about 11 p.m. on suspicion in the High Point area.

Gibson is accused of fondling some of the boys and having oral sex with at least one of them, McKenna said. The alleged abuses took place during the past six months on camping trips and in the High Point area where the troop meets.

Gibson, who is unemployed and receives Social Security, is Scoutmaster of Troop 410, which has a membership of about 23 youths, McKenna said. Gibson, who has some sight, has been associated with the troop for two and a half years.

"We just heard about this at 5 p.m. Sunday and began our investigations then," McKenna said.

The sheriff's department became involved after some of the parents learned from their sons of Gibson's alleged sexual abuses. The parents got together over the weekend and matched their sons' stories for accuracy and then decided to call authorities, McKenna said.

Just about all the boys had the same story, McKenna said. Gibson is accused of fondling some of the

boys while they were taking showers, McKenna said. And the scoutmaster allegedly lured the boys into some encounters under the pretense of helping them work on merit badges and other scout-related things, he said.

The youths didn't talk anyone about Gibson sooner, the detective said, because the man had asked them not to say he would get in trouble and probably go to jail if they did.

Board members of the Pinalosa Area Council of the Boy Scouts told McKenna it is their policy to make background checks on all persons who are to work with the youths. Their check on Gibson came up clean, they said. And Gibson has no prior criminal record, McKenna said.

Other alleged victims have come forward since Gibson's arrest, McKenna said. As a result, the investigation is continuing, he added.

Scout Leader Charged With Sexual Battery

A Boy Scout troop leader was arrested Sunday on one count of involuntary sexual battery and two counts of lewd and lascivious conduct stemming from several incidents that occurred on weekend troop outings, sheriff's officials said today.

Joe Noel Gibson, 42, 15555 60th St. N, Clearwater, was arrested Sunday in connection with the charges and placed in the county jail on \$55,000 bail, jail records show.

Gibson, according to scouting records of the Pinellas Area Council, is Scoutmaster of Troop 410. Some 23 boys are members of the troop that meets at the Highpoint Volunteer Fire Department, council scouting records show. He had been connected with the scout troop for the past 2 1/4 years.

Gibson is unemployed and legally blind, sheriff's officials said.

Boys, ranging in age from 10 to 12, complained first to their parents and then to sheriff's deputies that Gibson sexually abused them while on scout trips, sheriff's officials said. Some of the instances of sexual abuse took place in the High Point area as well, officials said.

On several occasions, when boys were taking showers, Gibson is accused of fondling them, Sgt. Terry McKenna said.

In one case, Gibson is accused of having oral sex with one of the young scouts, he said.

A weekend parents' meeting, held to determine the accuracy of what one boy had told his mother and father, led to complaints to the sheriff's department, officials said. Gibson was arrested at 5 p.m. Sunday, sheriff's officials said.

The instances of sexual abuse occurred during the past six months, McKenna said.

Gibson was in charge of health care and first aid on scouting trips, sheriff's officials said. Sheriff's officials said they know of at least five boys in the troop who said they were victims of the sexual abuse.

"There may be more because not all the parents are aware of what has been going on," McKenna said.

According to McKenna, Gibson has no prior record.

Council scouting officials routinely run background checks on leaders who apply to work with scouts, McKenna said. "They (scouting leaders) do what they can (to run character checks)," McKenna said.
