Dear Mr. McClure:

This will acknowledge receipt of your recent letter concerning the registration of your son as an Assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 125. I regret to advise you that we are unable to provide you with any information.

As you know, because of your own association with Scouting, the Boy Scouts of America is primarily concerned with inculcating its objectives of character development and citizenship training in the lives of youth and registration as a leader, which includes the position of Assistant Scoutmaster, is a privilege and not a right.

Occasionally, the Boy Scouts of America decides that, in its best judgment, it is unwilling to accept an application to commission an individual for a leadership role. Whenever it makes this determination, it gives no reasons for this action and this is never intended as a criticism or accusation of any type.

It is my sincere recommendation that you discuss with your son his activities during the time he was in the Navy and associated as Assistant Scoutmaster in Troop 278 in San Diego. I feel certain that your son must have knowledge of possible reasons why the Boy Scouts of America would be unwilling to accept his registration.

Gentlemen,

My son, John A. McClure, was active in Troop 125, Ventura, and received his Eagle Award during that time. Upon returning home from the Navy he completed an application to serve as Assistant Scout Master, and forwarded it to the Ventura County Council last fall. His application was UK'd by the current Scout Master of Troop 125, by the Committee Chairman of that troop; and, we are informed by the Council Office, by the District Executive, Mr. John Gessford.

One of the reasons for filing this action was to be currently associated with a unit so that he would be qualified to work on his God and Country award. He has worked with the ministers of the church during this time, and had previously been doing parts of the award requirements through church activities. We have just been advised by the Council office that John is ineligible for this award, subsequent to he and the ministers completing and filing all the necessary papers. The reason given by the Council was that he was not officially approved and registered with the troop.

In discussions with the Council it develops that Mr. Gessford did approve and forward his application for Ass't. S.M., and upon not having word from National he followed up for their reply. We have just this past week learned that National replied to Mr. Gessford in January of their disapproval, but it has never been communicated to us. During all this time John has been diligently striving to qualify for the award, and certainly should have had notification of the disapproval. Too, the troop should have had notice because it affects them also.

Inasmuch as the local Council has no knowledge of this declination I would appreciate word from you regarding the reason therefor. I feel entitled to know this as his father, and as a Troop Committeeman and formerly Chairman of the Committee. With many, many years of scouting affiliation I have never had knowledge of this kind of action; and feel that both in view of these years of activity and John's efforts that we are entitled to an answer.

He is in the US Navy and at present assigned to North Island San Diego, Calif. His permanent address is with his parents; Mr. and Mrs. Robert McClure, 190 Dean Court, Ventura, Calif. He joined the Navy on the 28th of March in 1967 and claims to be an Eagle Scout of the Ventura Council.

He has admitted and it has been recorded by special agents of the office of Naval Intelligence that his first homosexual experience occurred when he was 14 years of age.

He registered as Assistant Scoutmaster of Troop 278 on October 17, 1967 and both at Troop meetings and hikes he involved at least three or more boys between the ages of 12 and 14 in homosexual acts. The pattern being as he quotes " I then took the boy's penis in my mouth in an act of oral copulation while I at the same time self-masturbated myself".

## ARTICLE II — PURPOSE: CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT — CITIZENSHIP TRAINING

"The purpose of this corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8, 1910, and restated in Section 3 of the charter granted by Congress June 15, 1916, as follows: 'That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts' by placing emphasis upon the Scout Oath or Promise and Law for character development, citizenship training, and physical fitness.'—*Constitution of the Boy Scouts of America.*

## GRANTING COMMISSIONS AND CERTIFICATES OF MEMBERSHIP

The *Constitution and Bylaws of the Boy Scouts of America* authorize commissions and certificates of membership only to those who subscribe to the Scout Oath or Promise and Law, the declaration of religious principle (as printed below), and its Constitution and Bylaws and are citizens of the United States, or have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the U. S.

## ARTICLE IV—DECLARATION OF RELIGIOUS PRINCIPLE

"Section 1. The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizenship without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Boy Scout's Oath or Promise the boy declares, 'On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law.' The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favors and blessings are necessary to the best type of citizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the boy may be—Catholic or Protestant or Jew—this fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the organization or institution with which the Boy Scout is connected shall give definite attention to his religious life.

"Only persons willing to subscribe to this declaration of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Boy Scout program."

### THE SCOUT OATH OR PROMISE

On my honor I will do my best  
To do my duty to God and my country and to obey the  
Scout Law;  
To help other people at all times;  
To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and  
morally straight.

### THE CUB SCOUT PROMISE

I, ( \_\_\_\_\_ ), promise to do my best  
To do my duty to God  
And my country,  
To be square, and  
To obey the Law of the Pack.

### THE SCOUT LAW

1. A Scout is trustworthy.  
A Scout's honor is to be trusted. If he were to violate his honor by telling a lie or by cheating or by not doing exactly a given task when trusted on his honor, he may be directed to hand over his Scout badge.
2. A Scout is loyal.  
He is loyal to all to whom loyalty is due, his Scout leader, his home and parents and country.
3. A Scout is helpful.  
He must be prepared at any time to save life, help injured persons, and share the home duties. He must do at least one Good Turn to somebody every day.
4. A Scout is friendly.  
He is a friend to all and a brother to every other Scout.
5. A Scout is courteous.  
He is polite to all, especially to women, children, old people, and the weak and helpless. He must not take pay for being helpful or courteous.
6. A Scout is kind.  
He is a friend to animals. He will not kill nor hurt any living creature needlessly, but will strive to save and protect all harmless life.
7. A Scout is obedient.  
He obeys his parents, Scoutmaster, patrol leader, and all other duly constituted authorities.
8. A Scout is cheerful.  
He smiles whenever he can. His obedience to orders is prompt and cheery. He never shirks nor grumbles at hardships.
9. A Scout is thrifty.  
He does not wantonly destroy property. He works faithfully, wastes nothing, and makes the best use of his opportunities. He saves his money so that he may pay his own way, be generous to those in need, and helpful to worthy objects. He may work for pay, but must not receive tips for courtesies or Good Turns.
10. A Scout is brave.  
He has the courage to face danger in spite of fear and to stand up for the right against the coaxings of friends or the jeers or threats of enemies, and defeat does not down him.
11. A Scout is clean.  
He keeps clean in body and thought; stands for clean speech, clean sport, clean habits; and travels with a clean crowd.
12. A Scout is reverent.  
He is reverent toward God. He is faithful in his religious duties and respects the convictions of others in matters of custom and religion.

### BOYS' LIFE

Registered adult members are entitled to a half-price membership rate of \$1.50 a year or 12½ cents a month. (Regular rate is \$3.) A *Boys' Life* subscription should be for the same number of months as an individual's registration, but the first issue of *Boys' Life* will not normally arrive for approximately 2 months. Your local council will transmit your subscription on the appropriate unit or council roster form.

*Boys' Life* is published by the Boy Scouts of America and contains some of the best of fiction, hobbies, crafts, sports, and outdoor crafts and skills. Program material is coordinated with unit program themes.

### APPROVAL

The application of the Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Explorer Advisor, and their assistants and Den Mothers should be approved by the chairman of the unit committee. Applications of unit committeemen and the institutional representative must be approved by the head of the institution or sponsoring body. Council Scouters should be approved by the proper council authority.

### REGISTRATION FEES

If applicant already holds an unexpired registration certificate in another capacity, no fee is required with this application, unless he is ceasing activity in the other capacity. In such case he should pay a proportionate fee to the expiration of this registration.

Annual adult fee is \$1, but for periods of less than 1 year, registration will be proportionate to the period to be covered, as shown on the front side.
