Thank you for your reply to our idenification questionnaire concerning Bill Adams. From the information you provided, it is certain that this is the same man as one we have on our Confident al File.





## REQUIREMENTS FOR ADULT REGISTRATION

Troop leaders with the troop must have three male committeemen 21 years of age or older with one named chairman. The Scoutmaster must also be 21 or older, while assistant scoutmasters may be 18. The troop must have a minimum of five beys.

### ADULT AND BOY ROSTERS

Unit status. Indicate status of troop at the new, R—reregistering, S—separated-reregistering. Complete the rest of this line (except the four J814801 spaces "For Office Use Only")....

Name column.—Print or type 1977 mame (first name, initial, last name). Then complete address and citysolumns.

State and Zip code.—Use the new two-latter jost office abbieviation for your State followed by your Zip code. Example: 113 08903

Age column.—List each applicant's age. Boys must be 11 and under 48.

Boys' Life column.—Mark "X" in column for all boys and leaders who are paying for Boys' Life. On Scoutmaster's line mark "S" for complymentary subscription (enter on COMPLIMENTARY line at top of "Boy Roster") or "G" for cash commission, if either is applicable (see "Boy Roster!!:

Status column.—Indicate Individual status of boy or leader as N-new (first time registered), R-reregistering, S-separated-reregistering, Ttransfer, M-multiple (for adults only), or B-new Boy Scout, formerly a Cub Scout (for boys only).

Former unit column,—If boy or leader has current unexpired registration card from another unit, and the status is "T" or "M," list former unit with unit initial (P-pack, T-troop, E-post) and its number.

Partial fee column,-If boy or leader is transferring from another unit and paying other than normal fee, indicate fee being paid.

#### ADULT ROSTER

Organization or group of citizens.—Give full name and address of institution or group; initials or abbreviations cannot be accepted. Institution is obligated to provide adequate facilities, supervision, and leadership and to help provide Boy Scouts with the opportunity for a year-round outdoor program including 10 days and nights of camping during the 1-year registration period. If unit is a neighborhood patrol, write "Neighborhood Patrol" in this space.

Institution head,-Give full name, title, address, and telephone.

Scoutmaster trained.-Check this line if Scoutmaster is fully trained.

Sex column.-Indicate M for male. Females cannot register with troops

Telephone B or H column,-Give telephone number and indicate if number is B for business or H for home. Example: (B)249-6000

Position column (POS.).—Use the following code letters to indicate leaders' positions and list in this order:

U.S. citizen column (U.S. CIT.),—Indicate citizenship as Y—U.S. citizen, D—declaration of intention, or N—other (visiting adult aliens must indicate country of citizenship, last address there, and any previous Scouting record in a note attached to this application).

Religious preference column (REL. PRF.).-Adults mark this column as B for Buddhist, C for Roman Catholic, J for Jewish, M for "Mormon," O for Orthodox, P for Protestant, and X for other faiths.

All adults must sign application on left side portion, using full name (first name, initial, last name). Institution head and local council representative must also sign in spaces provided.

#### BOY ROSTER

Boy's Life Subscription and Registration fee information.-Total the number of Boys' Life subscriptions for boys and adults, both paid and complimentary. If there are 10 or more paid subscriptions on initial troop order for current year, the Scoutmaster is entitled to a complimentary 1-year subscription or a cash commission of \$2 (or pro rata subscription term or commission).

In setting subscription term (months), plan for Boys' Life to expire 2 months beyond troop charter expiration date. This ensures uninterrupted service during next registration period.

Secure registration fees at yearly rate of \$2 per adult and \$1 per boy. Boys' Life fee is \$2 per person. Fees must accompany charter application -payable to the local council, Boy Scouts of America.

Other information.-Complete other details requested in top portion.

Complete columns as stated in "Adult Roster" directions.

Rask column.—Boy Scout ranks are indicated as T—Tenderfoot, 2—Second Glass, 1—Elist Class, S—Star, L—Life, and E—Eagle.

Complete top line of application. Give unit status as "A."

On adult form complete the following details:

Adult approval.—The application of Scoutmaster ex. assistant. Scoutmaster must be approved by troop committee chairman. Application for institu-tional representative or committee fine must be approved by likelitution head. Approval is indicated by appropriate signature on "institution Head" line on left side portion of application.

Scoutmaster trained.—Check the space if new Scoutmaster is fully trained.

"If no boy registrations" box .- If no boy applications are included, indicate adult fees and number of months registered (pins requested Boys' Life information if any subscribers).

EXTRACTS FROM THE CHARTER AND BYLAWS OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

#### **Granting Commissions and Certificates** of Membership

All persons serving in any official relationship with the Boy Scouts of America shall subscribe to the statement of religious principle . . , the Scout Oath and Law, and these Bylaws. Such persons shall be citizens of the United States, or . . . shall have legally declared their intentions to become citizens of the United States, or, in the case of minors, shall take an oath of allegiance to the flag and Government of the United States, or shall satisfy the requirements of Article XVI, Section 6, Clause 4 with respect to visiting adult aliens. Article XVIII, Section

#### Character Development, Citizenship Training, Mental and Physical Fitness

The purpose of the Corporation is as set forth in the original certificate of incorporation under the laws of the District of Columbia, dated February 8. 1910, and restated in the Act of Incorporation enacted by the Congress of the United States of America on June 15, 1916, as follows: "That the purpose of this corporation shall be to promote, through organization, and cooperation with other agencies, the ability of boys to do things for themselves and others, to train them in Scoutcraft, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance, and kindred virtues, using the methods which are now in common use by Boy Scouts." In achieving this purpose, emphasis shall be placed upon its educational program and the oaths, promises, and codes of the Scout program for character development, citizenship training, mental and physical fitness. Article I, Section 2.

#### Declaration of Religious Principle

The Boy Scouts of America maintains that no boy can grow into the best kind of citizen without recognizing his obligation to God. In the first part of the Scout Oath or Promise the boy declares, "On my honor I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law." The recognition of God as the ruling and leading power in the universe and the grateful acknowledgment of His favers and blessings are necessary to the best type of talizenship and are wholesome precepts in the education of the growing boy. No matter what the religious faith of the boy may be, this fundamental need of good citizenship should be kept before him. The Boy Scouts of America therefore recognizes the religious element in the training of the boy, but it is absolutely nonsectarian in its attitude toward that religious training. Its policy is that the home and the organization or institution with which the Scout is connected shall give definite attention to his refle-

Only persons willing to subscribe to this declarated tion of principle shall be entitled to certificates of leadership in carrying out the Scout program. Article II. Section 2.
