#### MARK BAKER

Mark Baker is a 26 year old Negro who has been serving in several leadership capacities in the Greater Roseland District, Chicago Area Council, BSA over the period of about one year (1963-64). He is married and has two children, a girl of about 3 yrs. and a boy of about 1.

He was instrumental in the organization of Boy Scout Troop 1742 at St. Joachim's Catholic Church, 700 E. 91st Street, and served as the Scoutarster of this unit from its inception in December of 1963 until about August of 1964. During this period he worked with a boy membership in excess of 50 boys. Under his leadership the unit did little camping but advanced in a normal manner. He was placed in the confidence of parents and institutional leadership. During the period mentioned, Mr. Baker was well known in the district for his excellent showmanship in award ceremonies.

Mr. Baker served as Assistant Scoutnaster of Treep 588 sponsored by the West Chesterfield Community Association. The Scoutnaster was Mr. Robert Holder, 9129 Burnside Ave. This unit also showed good boy growth but little advancement. He remained in this position from about January, 1964 to August, 1964. He then resigned from the above two units for reasons which are listed below.

From about February of 1964 to January of 1965, he served as Scoutmaster of Troop 764 sponsored by Vincent Methodist Church, located at 91st Place and Langley Ave. Here as in the previous units he was placed in great confidence by the parents of the boys and the pastor of the church, Rev. . It was decided by the minister that a room might be set aside for the use of the Scoutmaster to be used for counseling. He was given a key to the room and told to use it to advise and counsel the boys who were having difficulties adjusting in the unit. During his tenure in Troop 764, Mr. Baker raised the boy membership from eight boys to over 90.

In August of 1964 the district received a call from a Mrs. who was the mother of a boy in Scout Troop 588. She claimed that Mr. Baker had sexually molested for son, but upon further questioning by the Assistant District Executive and the Scoutmaster, Mr. Holder, it was brought out that Mr. Baker had taken the

boy into his counseling room at Vincent Methodist Church to teach him sext. The boy said that Mr. Baker had made him remove his trousers but did not touch him. A note might be added here that Mr. Baker denied the accusations and further accused the boy of lying. He supported this statement by saying the boy had been caught causing trouble in school, passing profane notes to girls, and his mother had been called in by the teacher. With this statement, the mother of the box agreed, but when the school was confronted, the teacher denied that she had talked to Mrs. in the time period in question.

The Assistant District Executive and Mr. Holder then met with the pastor of the church which sponsored the school where the boy, attended. This was St. Joachim's, the church which also sponsored Troop 1742 of which Mr. Baker was the Scoutmaster. At that time a decision was made to relieve Mr. Baker of his positions in both Troop 588 and 1742. Because there was no conclusive evidence of sexual molestation, and because of the lack of corroboration of any statements, Mr. Baker was allowed to continue in his position as Scoutmaster of Troop 764.

During this time he was kept under constant surveillance of the minister of that church who had been alerted about the situation.

The unit went to camp at Owasispe Scout Reservation in the summer of 1964, but Mr. Baker was not along. The unit went under the leadership of Mr. Cecil Williams who was registered as the Institutional Representative. Mr. Baker's plans for the summer of 1965 included a trip to Colorado.

On January 21, 165 the Assistant District Executive was called to the parsonage of Vincent Church by the pastor. At this time Mr. Baker had been evicted from his former residence, 612 E. 92nd St. and was living at the parsonage, 701 E. 91st

Rev. Said that a Mrs. , the mother of a boy in Vincent Troop

764 had been sexually molested by Mr. Baker, about a year before. When questioned about the time span involved she claimed that Mr. Baker had made a pact with the

boy "on his honer as a Scout", not to tell his parents about the homosexual act.

During the month prior to disclosure, a Mrs. the former wife of Mr.

Baker's foster brother (now living in California), had been calling the mothers of the boys in the troop and telling them that Mr. Baker was mentally disturbed.

She also said that Alice, Mr. Baker's wife had told her to do that. When Alice was confronted she denied this saying that she merely wanted Mrs. to talk to Mr.

Baker about his temper. These calls started a serie of rumors which passed through the families of the boys, possibly culminating in the revelation of the problem with the boy mentioned above,

On the morning of the 21st of January, when the Asst. Dist. Executive was called to the parsonage, Rev. said that Mr. Taker had admitted to his part in the act of homosexuality with and was in the process of purchasing a gun with which he had said be would take his life. A suicide note addressed to Rev. was left under the telephone. Rev. also went into Mr. Baker's room and form an interary which Mr. Baker was going to follow that day. After the purchase of the weapon, Mr. Baker was planning to go to the home where his wife and two crildren were staying since the eviction from their home about should take his own life. In the note which he left to the minister, Mr. Baker told that he felt he was "of no use to himself, his family, or the people who had placed their trust in him, so he could find no alternative."

That morning, Rev. went to the place where Mrs. Baker and the two children were staying as a preventative measure. The Asst. District Executive remained it the personage, also as a preventative measure. By the evening of Jan. 21st, Mr. Baker had committed himself to the care of a doctor, and through the aid of the minister, no harm had been done to Mr. Baker's family. No weapon was found on him. The police had been notified of the suspected suicide, but no action was taken. The authorities said no action could be taken unless the suspect had the weapon in his hand and was about to use it.

Mr. Baker was then committed to the Elgin State Mental Hospital, Elgin, Ill, where he was placed in the Veterans Ward under the care of a Dr. Flores. Because he was self committed, a period of fifteen days was required for Mr. Baker to remain in the care of the state. After this period he would be released as an out patient under the care of his doctor or one suggested by the state.

The minister and Assistant District Executive visited the Elgin Rospital and Dr. F. Florres who said Mr. Baker would be released at the end of the fifteen day period, and only by court order could be again be committed.

By this time an hysteria had been building up through remors which involved , and Mrs. Baker. There is a possibility that Mrs. Mrs. other mothers were involved. It was felt that it was to the best interest of all concerned, that Mr. Baker not return to the community and a sincere effort be made to prevent such a return. For this it was necessary for Mrs. to make a report to the Sex and Homocide Squad of the Police Dept. and further to make a complaint which would result in a court order. The Sex-Homocide detectives who wrote the report were Joseph Gonzales and John Henry of the Area #2 precinct. The report was made on Wednesday, Feb. 3rd. 1965 at the Kensington Police Station, Kensington and Indiana Ave. Presentingere & Mrs. Rev. and the Assistant District Executive. The next morning, Mrs. had a court order made for Mr. Baker sarrest and subsequent confinement where, as of this report, he is now in jail. FURTHER NOTES

Immediately before becoming a Scoutmaster in Greater Roseland, Mr. Baker served in the U.S. Army where he held the position of Scoutmaster in the Pikes Peak Council.


