

Since receipt of your recent letter concerning Theodore J. Ciminski, I have carefully read the file of material Which you forwarded to us in July, 1961.

Even though the official charges against Mr. Glainski have been dropped through insufficient evidence and not withstanding the pressure which is being exerted by various individuals you mention for his asinotatement, it is our judgement that Mr. Ciminski should not be registered with the May Scouts of America.

There does not always have to be sufficient proof to convict an individual in order to have the officient of the Boy Scouts of America believe that an individual may not be the most desirable type of individual to merve as a leader of youth through the Scouting program. The information which you presented to us nearly two years ago is more than sufficient indication to the Boy Scouts of America that it does not desire the services of Ar. Ciminski as a Scout leader. As you well know, the Boy Scouts of America is not obligated to accept the application of every individual vice might apply for registration status. Rather, the Boy Scouts of America reserves the right to accept registrations from those individuals it feels are best qualified to give the best type of character building and citizenship training leadership to boys in the Scouting program. We seriously doubt whether Mr. Ciminski is se qualified and, therefore, regret to advise you that we cannot reconsider any application for his reinstatement in the Scouting program.
