

INFORMATION REGARDING

WESLEY G. ENOCH

Editorial from "Kansas City Times" called "About Town" by Landon Laird.

"A HOAX has been pulled on two Boy Scout troops, one white and one Negro, in Kansas City. We get the story from Jerry Penzer, 8300 W Ninety-second Street, Overland Park, a Scoutmaster in the case.

It seems that 11-day trips to Detroit, Niagara Falls, New York, Washington and Chicago were promised by an anonymous benefactor, who wanted the boys to have a good time and see something of the United States. Great plans were made by the youngsters until the denouement: the "benefactor" vanished. It's a tough jolt to little boys' hopes."

Wesley Enoch initiated plans which were never carried out and proved to be a hoax.

Following information secured from John R. Lewis, District Executive, Kaw Council, Kansas City, Kansas:

Wesley G. Enoch contacted Troop sponsored by Cherokee Hills Community Church Brethren, offered Troop Committee to secure permanent Troop campsite from friend. Troop visited campsite, but committee later found out that owner did not know Mr. Enoch and site could not be made available on permanent basis.

Mr. Enoch suggested to Troop Committee that their Troop (White Scouts) make a tour throughout the East Coast with another Troop (Negro Scouts). Schedule was to have included Chicago, Niagara Falls, New York, Washington and several other points of interest. Mr. Enoch informed Troop Committee that a wealthy benefactor friend of his would underwrite the cost of the trip - \$20,000.00 was quoted.

Troop Committee arranged for buses and sleeping facilities for the tour. When they approached Mr. Enoch he promised them that he would see that an initial check was sent. After some delay they approached him several times and when situation became somewhat embarrassing to Troop Committee a forceful visit with Mr. Enoch the fact developed that there was no benefactor and that the whole thing was a hoax.

A previous attempt with a similar plan by Mr. Enoch was made with one of the Troops in the Kansas City, Missouri Council, but fortunately it was spotted by the local District Executive and immediate steps were taken to remove Mr. Enoch from relationship with that Unit.

Supposed benefactor identified by Mr. Enoch was contacted and indicated that he did not know Mr. Enoch and was very sorry that his name had been used to perpetrate such a fraud, especially with boys and parents involved.

Dear Ernest:

The first step in sending us information concerning a Scouter, you have already taken. That is writing a letter giving the reason why a request is made. The next step is to complete a confidential record sheet, so that we will have a means of identification, should he attempt to register. I am enclosing one.

You do not say whether he is registered now and we do not have any information about him, so assume that he was not in Scouting when he got into difficulty. If he is now registered, please tell us where on the record sheet.

It will be helpful if Mr. Billings would give you a confidential statement why he is on parole in Kansas City and perhaps spell out a little more of your statement "crime against a child". You can assure Mr. Billings that such statements are kept under lock and key and shared with no one.

Please inform me as to the proper procedure to be followed to see that a man is placed on the confidential list.


Wesley G. Enoch of 11208 Lake View, Raytown, Missouri, should not be permitted to register with the Boy Scouts of America.

I have been working closely with Mr. Clyde Billings State Parole Officer and will supply whatever information you may need.
