Dear Les:

Ben Conger has turned over to me the correspondence concerning Reinhold Fried and Joseph T. Conway. As you recommend, we have placed Mr. Fried on the Confidential File and have completed the confidential record sheet as much as possible from the information given in your letter of April 25th. Will you please complete the additional items required so that we can properly identify him in the future.

Now to Sgt. Conway. You certainly have illuminous information concerning him. My comment is that if you will not register him in your council, you should place him on the Confidential File for the protection of other councils. We would then refuse to register him until at least the council is aware of all the problems surrounding his leadership.

Actually, Les, the National Council does not place anybody on the Confidential File without the recommendation of the local council. Therefore, I am not in a position to decide if he should be placed on the confidential list; except as I have already stated, if you will not register him, then he should be placed on the file for the protection of other councils. I am enclosing a confidential record sheet for him. Your signature on the bottom will be accepted as your recommendation that he be placed on the Confidential File. As soon as we have these two record sheets, we can complete our files.

I will hold the information on Sgt. Conway until we hear from you. If you do place him on the file, we would like to have this for our files. This becomes a part of the permanent record and is shared with no one. Actually, there should be one Confidential File, and that is in the home office. It is best for your protection that you do not have too much of this kind of information in your files.

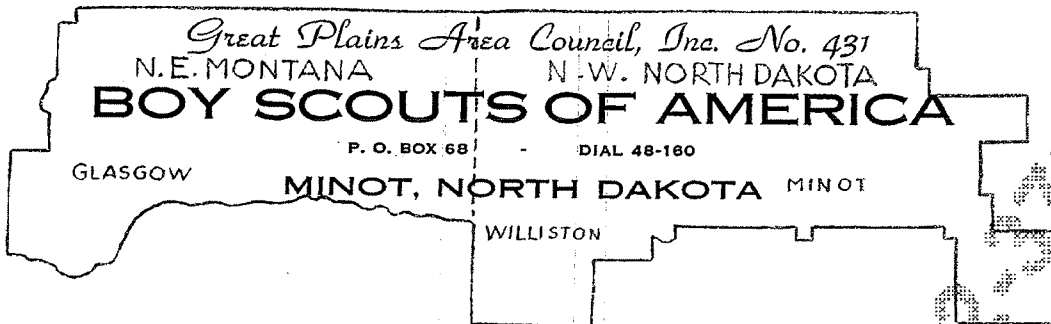

According to our records, Mr. Fried was registered as new on December 9, 1958, when he registered as a Committeeman of Pack 419, sponsored by the Roosevelt School P.T.A. of Minot. He registered as an American citizen, his age was 38, his religious preference protestant.

The additional enclosed material concerning Joseph T. Conway will give you a clearer picture than that which I could detail for you. After you have reviewed the circumstances surrounding the action taken concerning Mr. Conway, I trust that you will be in a position to decide if he should or should not be placed on the confidential list.

If further information is desired or needed, we shall endeavor to comply. I should have the enclosed material on Mr. Conway returned to me, if it isn't needed for your files.
