We have just received the re-registration for Troop 9, which lists Neil Lawrence as a Committee Member. We are unable to approve Mr. Lawrence's registration and therefore have deleted his name from the unit roster. A refund of his fee will follow.

It will be necessary for you to advise Mr. Lawrence that he can not be registered and I suggest that you do this in person. Merely tell him that you are sorry, but that the National Council will not approve his registration. Please make no reference at all to the confidential file. Certainly Mr. Lawrence should be aware of the reason and this will give him the opportunity to withdraw gracefully giving whatever reason he wishes.

### er Youth, 22, Sentenced as Deviate

Neil E. Lawrence, 22, 526 S. Blackhawk St., Tuesday morning was ordered committed to the state prison at Waupun under the sex deviate law for an indefinite period to undergo further treatments as determined by the State Department of Public Welfare. Judge Ralph F. Gunn ordered the action after receipt of findings by the state department in a 60-day examination that was just completed at Waupun. That examination has been ordered by the court after Lawrence had entered guilty pleas on March 3 to three morals counts, all felonies involving teen-age, Janesville boys. Janesville police detectives arrested Lawrence March 2. The offenses to which he pleaded guilty occurred here on or about Feb. 1 and Nov. 1, 1960 and Jan. 15, 1961. He also admitted several others that occurred elsewhere in Rock County. Lawrence was represented by the Geffs law firm in the court proceedings.

PURPOSE OF VISIT:

TO REVIEW AND ADVISE REGARDING PROBLEM OF SEX DEVIATE CHARGED WITH IMMORAL ACTS WITH BOYS ON COUNCIL CAMP PROPERTY. TO ASSIST IN SELLING PROGRAM OF SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP WITH COUNCIL OFFICERS.

CONDITIONS FOUND:

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPEAR GOOD. COUNCIL MUST RAISE ABOUT \$10,000 TO MEET ITS CURRENT BUDGET AND REMOVE DEFICIT. COUNCIL OFFICERS ARE INCLINED TO RAISE THE MONEY UNDER FALSE CAUSE OF CAMP IMPROVEMENT.

ACTIVITY OF ONE NEIL LAWRENCE, 22 YEARS OF AGE, WAS REVEALED BY A 14 YEAR OLD BOY CHARGED WITH INDECENT EXPOSURE. HE IMPLICATED SEVERAL OTHER BOYS AND MR. LAWRENCE. MUCH OF THE ACTIVITY IN QUESTION HAD TAKEN PLACE AT THE COUNCIL CAMP DURING FALL AND WINTER MONTHS. MR. LAWRENCE HAS BEEN EMPLOYED AS A CAMP STAFF MEMBER AND HAS CARRIED KEYS FOR THE CAMP.

MR. LAWRENCE IS NOW COMMITTED TO A 60 DAY STAY FOR OBSERVATION IN THE STATE HOSPITAL. HIS CASE IS DUE BEFORE THE COURTS ABOUT MAY 1.

ACTION TAKEN:

ASSISTED IN PLANNING DETAILS OF DRIVE FOR SUSTAINING MEMBERSHIP.

INVESTIGATED CASE OF MR. LAWRENCE AND ARRANGED FOR COUNCIL PRESIDENT TO MEET WITH ME TO DISCUSS POTENTIAL PROBLEMS.

NEIL LAWRENCE - Scoutmaster

C This young man was recommended to Milton College by the principal of Jamesville High School under date of July 3, 1957. It was predicted he might be "an average student" - (199/365).

O Our admissions record shows a fair rating on our tests, but his academic attainments at Milton College placed him on probation after one year. Probation was extended twice - 6/58 and 2/59. He was dropped in June, 1959 "for one year" after a very poor record in that second semester.

P He had practically no associates on this campus. Being a daily commuter, we had little opportunity to observe his social life. Frankly, he was rated "an odd ball", but no evidence of vicious, anti-social habits was detected here. Most of us considered him an overgrown juvenile. He was evidently not a virile young man. Probably, our attitude was one of pity.

P THE ABOVE CAN BE OF LITTLE VALUE TO THE COURT.

Y May I add a few comments as an experienced Scouter (Former Scout Executive in New York City and National Director of Registration). I recoil at the recollections of too many of those cases.

Y A fleeting suspicion concerning Neil Lawrence crossed my mind once at an evening dinner at Camp Indian Trails. My comment to the Camp Director at that time was not pointed, for I saw no untoward act, but rather weak leadership.

Any other comment would be purely hindsight.

This is a very unfortunate affair for all concerned. I fully understand the policy of the Boy Scouts of America and believe the less talk the better. Action is imperative.

I am reasonably sure you will find the local Council officials cooperative in this matter. As one of that group, I can offer absolutely no evidence of immorality, but the developments do not surprise me. The Developments shock us.

He will never again be registered by the Boy Scouts of America. This is a national policy of long standing.


