Last week my barber told me of an incident between Merle and the barber's som which is conclusive.

The boy, then 13, had been invited by Merie to ride to Jacksonville with Merle, as company. Parents said OK. Merle was a member of their church, and at the time was renting an apartment with them.

After the meeting, on the way home, Merle made immoral advances, carried out acts, and extracted a promise from the boy not to tell his folks. This happened about three menths before Merle resigned from the prefessional service.

After Merle left Springfield the boy told his parents, but they decided not to say enything about it because Merle had left the profession. A recent arrest and conviction here caused the barber te tell me about it. I asked why he did not tell me before and he said, "Well, I figured he was out of Scouting so it would not make any difference."
