Dear Paul:

This is regarding Joseph P. Kolp, Jr. (not Joseph F. as I wrote previously) in my original letter to you concerning his misconduct and our relieving him of any responsibility in Scouting. I do not have anything in writing other than what I am going to put below.

On Friday night, July 12, I met with Mr. Kolo and Chuck Bond, who is Chief of the <u>Pipestone organization in our Council. Prior to this meeting, I met with </u> , a 19-year old member of our camp staff, and Dave Durell, our Camp Director. had confided in Ourell and Dave had asked me to meet with them to hear story. The incident happened when was 16 years old while on an outing to our new camp with the Pipestone group to clear trails. Mr. Kolo and were the only two who went. They did some work and then camped overnight in an area near camp. During the overnight camping experience, they drank beer and vocka and played strip poker. Toward the end of the card game, Mr. Kolo took Polaroid pictures of told us that because of so much drinking, he got sick, went out of the tent, and then came back in and did not pass out, but laid down feeling very lousy. He said that he was sexually molested at that time and that nothing else happened the remainder of the event. They went home the next day. was afraid to talk to anyone about the incident, although he did visit with two different psychologists because of the guilt feelings he had. He said he came forward now because he was approached again by Mr. Kolp to go on a weekend water skiing trip. I told Mr. Kolo of these allegations, and he admitted that he had contributed to the delinquency of a minor through the purchase of beer and vodka, that he did play strip poker, and that he did take pictures of the in the nude. He said that he did not assault him sexually. Soth Mr. Sond and myself felt that there was enough admitted charges to deny him registration in our organization, and we both have strong feelings that he did not tell the truth about the assault.

Hope this is of help.

Dear Paul:

This is to inform you that a volunteer Scouter who was registered in our Council and in the Great Trail Council should no longer be registered as an adult Scouter. His name is Joseph F. Kolo, Jr., 317 West Fifth Street, North Canton, OH 44720. His phone number is (216) 499-7005. He is white, approximately 28 years old, and single.

A young man on our Camp Staff met with me a short time ago with some very strong charges against Mr. Kolp. I met with him last Friday and reviewed the allegations. He admitted doing many of them, but denied any sexual contact with the young man. There are no legal charges pending, but I feel he has definitely contributed to the delinquency of a minor and could be prosecuted and found guilty if charges were brought forth. He has agreed to terminate his membership in Scouting.

If you need anything further, please let me know. I have also enclosed a copy of a news clipping that appeared in our local newspaper May 10, 1985. We sent a copy of this article to the Communications Division as part of the ongoing public relations information requested by the National Office.


