To Whom It May Concern:

Lee Fisher had stayed in our home several times and gave no indication of his character until one night when my wife was staying with her mother. I told him he could sleep on our bed because he didn't feel well and I went to visit my wife for about an hour; when I returned Lee was asleep (so I thought) on our bed and, because it is a King size bed I decided to let him sleep and climbed in on the other side. When he thought I was asleep he began to fool around - - first with himself and then he tried to fool with me. I let him know that I was not asleep and he stopped.

The next day I had a talk with one of my boys who was in his troop,

San Francisco Troop 121, and admitted, reluctantly, that Lee

Fisher had tried to fool around sexually with him also.

Lee by threatening to tell me about it.

Other stories have been told but are not of my personal knowledge and therefore would be considered hearsay but with what I know and what I have personally experienced with Lee would lead me to believe he is not suitable to lead boys of any kind especially boys in a large group like a boy scout troop.

# BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

To Whom It May Concern:

Last year for approximately three months the young soldier in question, Walter Lee Fisher, resided in our home. We have three sons and a daughter; the boys were, at that time, all members of San Francisco Troop daughter; the oldest two were Star Scouts and the youngest, ll years old, a new Scout brought into the troop by Mr. Fisher.

In the course of his stay here at our home the boys complained about several actions on his part. Our little boy, was on an Enueretic Program which awakened him during the night and he had to wash his face until fully awakened and then void. Mr. Fisher slept in the hall and it turns out that he would pull into his bed at night and massage him all over including the area around the genitals. Which tell us until after Mr. Fisher left our home, but he did tell us that he didn't want to sleep with Mr. Fisher because he was afraid of him.

The two youngest boys also complained of him playing ju jitsu and putting his hand over their genital area telling them it was part of ju jitsu. The layer old, told him not to touch him anymore but he continued when alone with said he was afraid to tell us because of Mr. Fisher's temper.

We also discovered from our little 8 year old girl and her friend that he had, on occasion, taken baths with the door open fully knowing there were little girls present in the house.

It may seem strange that we didn't know all of this while he reseded with us but we rarely go upstairs in the evening and his manners in our presence were very polite so we didn't suspect anything amiss.

On the other hand, the children were afraid of him with his very bad temper and sometimes, they said, he physically pinned them down enough to make the 2 little ones cry. We feel that this man is not suitable to be a Boy Scout leader.

WALTER LEE FISHER - Scoutmaster, Troop 121 sponsored by Star of the Sea Catholic Church.

Occupation - Spec. 4 U. S. Army - Letterman General Hospital Presidio of San Francisco.

Description - approx. 5 ft. 10 in. - light brown hair - white male - single. Age 22.

Raised in Bakersfield, California.. Was in Scouting there as a boy. Parents still reside there.

After many requests, Fisher was referred to the committee of Troop 121 of the Star of the Sea Catholic Church as a potential assistant leader. The committee met him and because they had no Scoutmaster asked him to assume that position in the Troop. This was in April of 1971.

Fisher had had no prior training as a Scoutmaster and was allowed to take the Troop on weekend outings which he did willingly by himself. These included the Spring Camporee, Summer Camp in August at Camp Royaneh, and numerous other weekends. His only help on these outings was from men in the Army who were friends of his. The fathers from the Troop were delinquent in not insisting that one or two of their members were present at all times. Fisher did discourage their help, however.

At a parents' committee meeting July 31, 1971, at which Fisher was present, strong objections were made by parents who reported their sons relating stories that were told at campfires by the Scoutmaster (Fisher), which were accounts of his (Fisher's) early sexual experiences. He also condoned the telling of stories with sexual undertones by the older boys in the troop with the young eleven year old boys present. Fisher admitted to these and promised to cease in the future.

During the above meeting no further allegations were made and the Troop went to summer camp under Fisher's leadership. There were complaints about the Troop's activities in camp.

One of the families who attended the July 31st meeting withdrew their three sons from the Troop and would not let them attend camp under Fisher's leadership. In an interview held November 16 with this family the whole story of why the above action was taken came out. It seems that Fisher had lived with this family for two months and unknown to the father and mother had made improper advances to all three boys. The parents became suspicious and the boys when asked told the whole story of their experiences with Fisher. Another father and his son also had similar experiences. All of these were related to the District Executive during the interview held November 16. All can be documented if necessary. The writer feels that this is unwise because of the embarrassment it could cause.

Fisher submitted his resignation as Scoutmaster on November 1, 1971 and it was accepted by the committee who are now aware of the entire proceedings leading up to this report. The Troop committee has made no charges in this matter as the family and boys involved are no longer members. The committee's only complaint involves the stories and language reported at the July 31st meeting, and a further complaint from the October Fall Camporee where boys were submitted to humiliating "initiation" ceremonies involving the undressing of boys.

It is the recommendation of this office that Walter Lee Fisher be placed on the Confidential List of the Boy Scouts of America, and that he not be allowed leadership position in Scouting in the future. A copy of this report is being forwarded to General Moncrief, Commanding General, Letterman General Hospital, for whatever action he may wish to take.
